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Community-Based Prevention Services

Community-based prevention is not focused on changing individual characteristics. Rather, the focus is on *population health*, that is, on “the health outcomes of a group of individuals, including the distribution of such outcomes within the group” (Kindig and Stoddart, 2003).

Primary Care Integration

Providing **INTEGRATED CARE** helps patients and their providers. It blends the expertise of **MENTAL HEALTH**, substance use, and **PRIMARY CARE** clinicians, with feedback from patients and their caregivers. This creates a team-based approach where **MENTAL HEALTH CARE** and general **MEDICAL CARE** are offered in the same **SETTING**.

Mental Health Disorders

1. Mood disorders include major depressive disorder, bipolar disorder (mania - euphoric, hyperactive, over inflated ego, unrealistic optimism), persistent depressive disorder (long-lasting low-grade depression), cyclothymia (a mild form of bipolar disorder), and SAD (seasonal affective disorder).
2. Anxiety disorders include generalized anxiety disorder (GAD), obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD), panic disorder, phobia, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), and social anxiety disorder.
3. Behavior disorders include disorders such as attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, conduct disorder, and oppositional defiant disorder.
4. Psychosis disorders include: schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, delusional disorder, and schizotypal disorder.

Substance Use Disorders

1. Alcohol
2. Illicit Drugs include marijuana/hashish, cocaine (including crack), heroin, hallucinogens, inhalants, or prescription-type psychotherapeutics used nonmedically.

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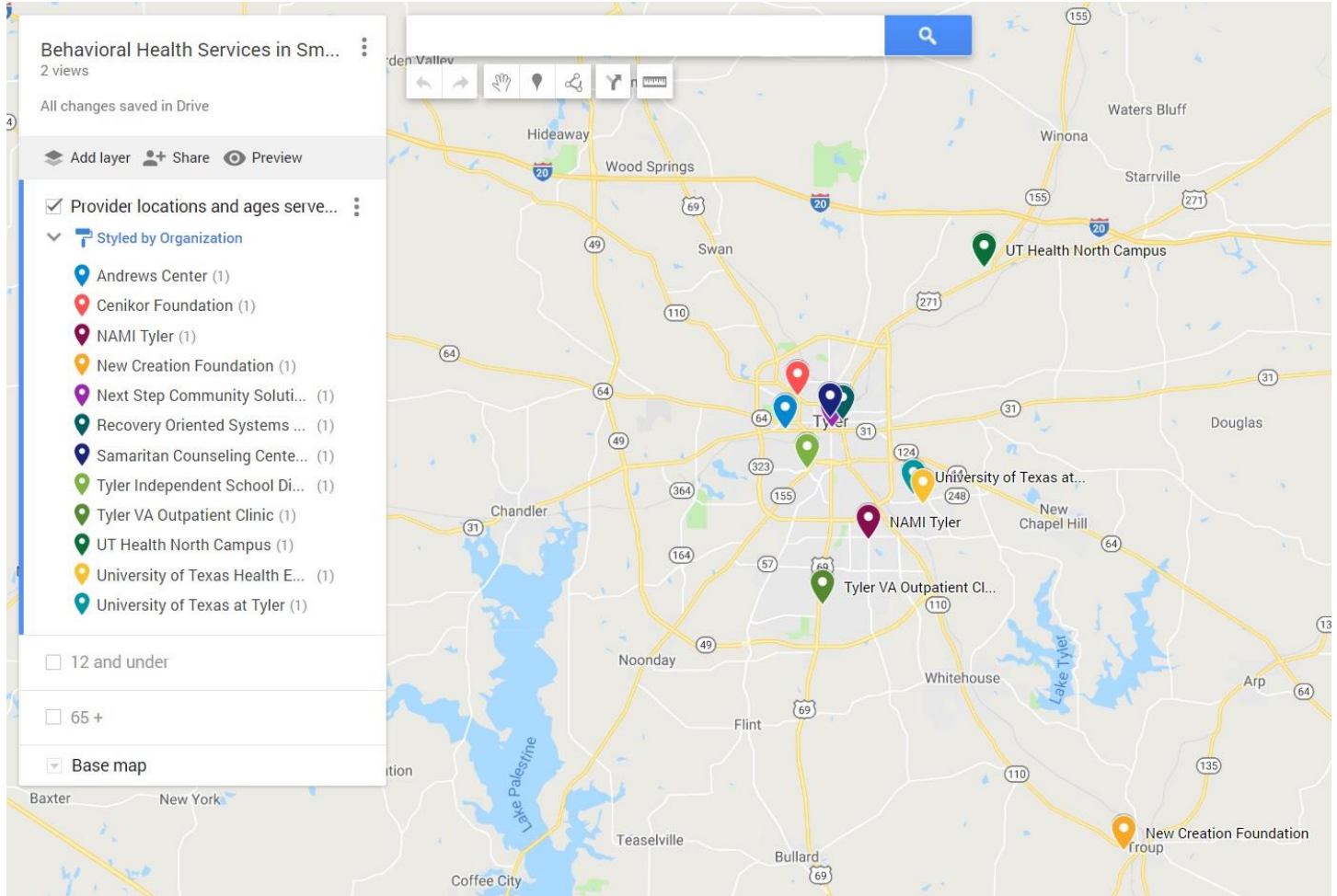
